Fourth Sunday of Easter

While baby-sitting my 3 year-old niece, I got into a comfortable chair, reading a book while she played with her toys on the floor. All of a sudden she jumped up, yelling that her father was home! He was nowhere in sight. Then I realized she had heard the distinctive sound of his truck and knew he was pulling in the driveway. His old engine gave his presence away!

We have a great memory for sounds! It's often easier to recall the melody of a song than the words, or we hear something that takes us back to our childhood. We recognize immediately the voices of those we love, like our families, and those we fear, like our teachers. A friendly voice we recognize can bring us comfort and reassurance, and we feel the personal relationship established once before.

The voice of the shepherd is something that sheep learn to recognize, just as we learn to recognize the voice of the Lord who calls us. We follow Him and learn to see His works, to hear his voice, to know when we are being led by God. In the silence of our prayers and thoughts, we hear God's voice. It brings us comfort, reassurance, grace and peace. Listen carefully and you will know how near He is.



WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR VOCATIONS

Today — Sunday, May 2nd — is a very special day. It marks the Annual World Day of Prayer for Vocations.

Many people, Church leaders and laity alike, are taking a serious look at the projected number of priests and religious in the Church. Those numbers, to so very many, are quite alarming. In our own diocese, the next several years has the capacity to see a large number of priests leave the active ministry due to retirement (not to mention sickness or death) and, at the same time, a relatively small number of people who will be ordained to the priesthood.

It makes us all ask the question: Where are we headed?

I had the opportunity to attend the annual convention for the Knights of Columbus in Indianapolis on April 16-18. At that convention, some of the priest chaplains of councils throughout the state gathered together to discuss issues of concern to the Knights. The topic of vocations was near the top of the list.

We discussed many of the reasons that we have heard for people not becoming priests. It is not uncommon nowadays to hear parents attempt to talk their sons and daughters out of Church vocations. The most common excuse: "You won't make any money."

When did fortune or fame or power become the most important thing in a person's life? It seems that many people in our society focus on those above all else, including serving the Lord.

We also discussed that in the past vocations appeared to be more numerous because families had more children and, therefore, if one or two children sought vocations in the Church, the family willingly supported them because there would be other children who would marry and "carry on" the family name. Now with families that have one or two children, parents are less supportive of a child entering the seminary or the convent.

What can we do? **PRAY**. **Pray** for an increase in Church vocations. **Pray** that people have the courage to respond to God's call. **Pray** that family members do not attempt to interfere with God's call.

We can also **INVITE** and **ENCOURAGE**. If you know someone who would be a good priest, brother or sister, tell that person. Encourage that person to discern whether or not God is calling.

We are in this together. If we do nothing, we will be in this alone — that is, I . Mike without any priests or religious.


STEWARDSHIP PRAYER

Questions ranged from his position on abortion (he is pro-life), to the type of car he drives (American), to what influenced him to run for office (he thought the office needed a younger person and all the people that told him he wouldn't be elected), to what sports he played while at St. Thomas More (basketball).




