# Stewardship REFLECTION

"Peter was distressed that Jesus had said to him a third time, 'Do you love me?' and he said to him, 'Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you.' Jesus said to him, 'Feed my sheep.'" John 21:17

All of us are challenged to show our love for Jesus and others. Discern how God is calling you to use your time in prayer, your talent in charitable works and your treasure to assist those who in need. Remember that giving is an act of worship and helps advance the mission of our parish and greater Church.

# Third Sunday of Easter

"Simon Peter said to them, 'I am going fishing." Peter is a favorite apostle for many people. I wonder if it is because of his flawed, relatable humanity. Today's Gospel takes place after Jesus appears to the disciples and breathes the Holy Spirit upon them. And yet, Peter finds himself returning to his old way of life, to comfortable habits he formed long before following Jesus. Is something still lingering in him? Is something still lingering in us? Lent is over, and we should be rejoicing! But do you feel like you're still holding onto something? Or perhaps you had an excellent Lent. You encountered Jesus in a new way and grew in faith. But as the weeks since Easter have slipped by, some of your newfound devotion has begun to waver. The closeness you felt in your Lenten commitments has given way to humdrum status quo or turn-of-the-season busyness.

"Simon, son of John, do you love me?" Peter has endured so much in his walk of discipleship! But something is still weighing on him. In today's Gospel, Jesus confirms Peter's devotion three times, a redemption of his earlier threefold denial. The call of the Lord must come again, as if heard anew for the first time. So often, this is the pattern of the Christian life. We discover God and experience a new desire for our faith, but in time, our enthusiasm begins to wane. Perhaps something happens that startles us, or we startle ourselves by a poor decision. Then we discover God anew! Our joy returns...for a while. Even the Apostles were no strangers to the cyclical nature of spiritual growth. Our disappointments or frustrations should not be cause for giving up. Like Peter, we too can recommit and start anew. This Sunday and every day of our lives, Jesus is waiting to say again, "Follow me."

#### MARY, A MODEL OF VIRTUE

"Never be afraid of loving the Blessed Virgin too much. You can never love her more than Jesus did." ~ Saint Maximilian Kolbe

When I was in grade school, every year, May became a very special month. The good Sisters would teach all of us about the wonders of the Blessed Virgin Mary. We would construct May altars in every classroom and would say extra prayers to Mary each day. We were encouraged to make May altars at our homes as well. My mother would always allow me to go hog wild on the altar construction up to the point of candles. She didn't trust us with lighting candles at our altars in the basement. (Smart move, there, Mom.)

It was good to have an introduction to Mary at such a young age. Because of it, I have carried a special devotion to Mary throughout my life. If you ever come into my office, you will see statues of Mary, busts of Mary, and a picture or two of Mary. The same holds for the house. I have a special love for her and it is rooted in one thing: her very special devotion to her Son, Jesus.

To me, Mary is a great model of virtue in that she, like us, had a free will and was invited to make a choice. Her choice was a resounding "Yes" to God's invitation to be the mother of His Son. You cannot find a better role model than that, in my opinion.

Many times, it has been exceedingly difficult to say yes to God. It has caused me to be uprooted after getting comfortable in different communities. It has caused me to stretch the bounds of my comfort zones as I have gone to schools, orphanages, inner cities, and even prisons. Saying yes to God does not mean that life will be easy. However, saying yes to God will come with a deep level of fulfillment.

Mary did not know where her life would lead after her yes but she went confident and unafraid. She was led into exile and into communities in which she probably never planned to live. She could not know that her yes would place her, one day, at the foot of the cross of her Son. But she knew one thing, she was the maidservant of the Lord and if the Lord asked her to do anything then, by golly, she was going to do what He said.

The month of May has traditionally been dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary. Take the time this month to pray with extra devotion to Mary, asking her to intercede for you to her Son. She was given to us as our mother by her Son when He hung on the cross. Count on her loving devotion.






