The Most Holy Trinity

Once I was at a meeting with representatives of various religions. On a coffee break, a man from another religion mused to me: "You know, with all our differences, all religions are really about being good people." I lowered my cappuccino and said as warmly as I could, "That's not what mine's about." His quizzical look begged for clarification. "Mine is about plunging into the life of God," I said.

Just before Jesus ascends into heaven, he commands the eleven apostles, "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you; and behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age." (Matthew 28:19-20).

The word "baptize" means "to immerse in, to plunge into."
It presupposes the use of water. But what does it mean to be immersed in God's name? In the Bible, God's name is identical to God Himself. So, to be baptized into water, using Jesus' formula, is to be plunged into the life of God. Said another way, it is to die with Jesus and rise with him as a member of his body.

The Trinity isn't a doctrine simply to accept and ponder. It's more like an ocean: a mystery into which we are baptized ... inserted, immersed, dunked, plunged. Baptism gives us power to live our lives as beloved children of God, patterned after Jesus himself, who is always with us, until the end of the ages. Hardly the same as being good people.

Stranger, but much better.

GIVE YOUR LIFE TO GOD

"I didn't need to understand the hypostatic unity of the Trinity; I just needed to turn my life over to whoever came up with redwood trees." ~ Anne Lamott

In the early Church, Greek scholars attempted to reconcile their speech to that of those who spoke Latin so that all people could better understand the teachings of the Church and the mysteries of God. Hypostasis came about to signify not the sameness of God but, rather, the distinctness of God in three Divine Persons. Are you confused enough already? So am I.

Anne Lamott seems to cut through all the theological chatter when she states that she does not need to understand definitions. She merely needs to come to grips with her creator. The same holds true for us.

Oh, we can talk theology. There is no problem with that. However, if our talk ends up confusing ourselves or others, it gets in the way. And when talk gets in the way, what do people often do? Walk away and look somewhere else for the answers to their questions.

Today, as we celebrate Trinity Sunday, we could easily bog ourselves down with definitions and theories and grand thoughts about the nature of God. Or, we could look around and see examples of God all around us.

For Lamott, it was whomever came up with redwood trees. For us it might be whomever came up with the great lakes or our children or absolutely stunning sunrises or sunsets.

God reveals Himself to us regularly. We do not have to search for Him in a scholarly kind of way (though, that is open to those who are so inclined to do so.) All we need to do is open our eyes, open our ears, and open our hearts. A day does not go by that God does not speak to us. We are often so busy looking at and doing other things that we fail to see Him or hear Him or feel Him.

Do not get bogged down with theories. Instead, become buoyed with realities. The reality is that God loves us all immensely. God reveals Himself to us every day. God blesses us through His creation and all that He has put in that creation. God is in the person next to you right now. Celebrate God today. After all, He celebrates you all the time.

FAITH ACTION: It is Sunday. If you have the time, get out and enjoy some of God's Fr. Mile creation. He made it just for you.

A Dynamic New Teen Ministry

for St. More Thomas More Teens

A Continuing Faith Formation Program is being created for high school teens here at St. Thomas More.

Currently in the planning process, it will launch in September.

All high school teens are invited to attend!

Young adults (age 18 to 40) are still needed for program planning and to serve as team leaders.

The vision for the program is that food, beverages and prayer will begin each meeting, allowing for time to socialize before delving into the evening's topic.

The main focus of each topic will be

"How does that part of our Catholic faith fit into my life?"

There are no tests or homework.

Teens are free to ask the questions. Team leaders are there to present the



topic, provide help, offer direction and act as guides. The group will meet Sundays from 5:00-7:00 p.m. twice each






